Trip to Leader Dog

The Lioness of Wisconsin MD 27 would like to plan a trip to tour the Leader Dog for the Blind School in Rochester Hills, Michigan in fall, 2017. A bus or caravan of cars would be the transport. The recommended visit dates for tours would be leaving Wisconsin Fri. Oct. 13, with an overnight at a hotel/motel at nearby Rochester Hills/Auburn and touring Leader Dog on Oct. 14, 2017 from 9 till 2:30, immediately returning home. Cost of the trip would include a comfortable chartered bus, bus driver's overnight stay, meals, parking, Lioness hotel/motel accommodations, and meals—total about \$275 to \$300 per Lioness. If a chartered bus is not feasible, and cars/vans are the transport, cost per person would be much less!
